Firstly, UNEG is a diverse network. We have 46 member agencies responsible for evaluation in the UN system, including the Secretariat offices and departments, regional commissions, funds, programmes and affiliated organizations. We work together to ensure that UNEG remains relevant to all members, regardless of size, location, subject focus or structure.

In 2015, the global evaluation community celebrates [the International Year of Evaluation](#) to advocate and promote evaluation and evidence-based policy making at international, regional, national and local levels. Additionally, as you know, in September, world leaders will gather at the United Nations Headquarters in New York City to renew their commitment to development and adopt the new Sustainable Development Goals agenda. This is an important period for all of us at UNEG, where we can seize the moment and join hands with all of our partners to promote evaluation.

2. UN entities and partners use evaluation in support of accountability and programme learning;

UNEG has also ventured into new areas and explored ways to enhance the utilization of evaluation while leveraging strategic opportunities arising from the celebration of the International Year of Evaluation, the passage of [UN General Assembly Resolution A/RES/69/237](#) “Capacity building for the evaluation of development activities at the country level”, and the negotiations around the Sustainable Development Goals. Through cooperation with partners, we have continued to contribute to the UN system-wide evaluations and national evaluation capacity development.

I am fully confident that, with the support and engagement of our UNEG colleagues and partners, we will continue the excellent work that UNEG has done thus far. And, together, we will make “UNEG fit for the future”.

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2015 Evaluation Week Follow-up

[2015 UNEG Evaluation Week](#) took place from 9 to 13 March 2015 at the UN Headquarters in New York City. It was composed of three events: UNEG Annual General Meeting (AGM), Evaluation Practice Exchange (EPE) seminars, and a High-level Event ‘Bridge to a Better World’.

The AGM reviewed progress and results of the 2014-2015 UNEG work programme and discussed the way forward. The [AGM Decisions and minutes](#) document is available.

The [2015 Evaluation Practice Exchange \(EPE\) Report](#) and the [Report on 2015 EPE Process and Feedback](#) are also available. The EPE Report includes summaries of each EPE session, with links of presentations and videos. 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UNEG 2015-2016 Workplan

UNEG 2015-2016 workplan is finalized after inclusive consultations with UNEG members. A total of 146 UNEG members from 38 agencies (note that some are double-counted as they are members of more than one SO) were engaged in developing the [2015-2016 UNEG Workplan](#), based on the guidance provided by the AGM.

Given the dynamic nature of UNEG, this workplan will be reviewed and updated in six months (November 2015). It includes two sections:

- Introduction, including the purpose of the document, a brief summary of the period 2014-2015, a brief overview of the upcoming period 2015-2016, and a summary of the preliminary budget; and
- Detailed programme of work by Strategic Objective.

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Updated UNEG Principles of Working Together and Strategy

At the 2015 UNEG Annual General Meeting, a decision was taken to constitute a temporary Task Force to update the [Principle of Working Together \(PoWT\)](#). The Task Force was led by the UNEG Chair and members of the taskforce include UNEG Heads from the following agencies: ICAO, IFAD, OIOS, UNEG Chair, UNEP, UNESCO, and UN-Habitat. Members were from the UN Secretariat, Funds and Programmes, and Specialized Agencies, from NY, Rome, Paris, Canada and Nairobi, which represent UNEG diversity well. In May 2015, [the PoWT](#) was updated as requested and endorsed by UNEG Heads on a non-objection basis. It is available on the [UNEG website](#).

Consequently, the [UNEG Strategy 2014-2019](#) was updated with the section, “How We Will Work Together” removed and the foreword updated.

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Post-2015 Advocacy Process and Progress and EvalYear Journey

UNEG has been following the post-2015 intergovernmental negotiations closely. The UNEG Chair, the Executive Group members, and the Senior Advisor for advocacy have approached close to 20 member states and MS groupings and actively advocated to insert evaluation into the post-2015 outcome document. During the [June intergovernmental negotiations on the outcome document](#), the United States, Mexico, Ghana and Switzerland indicated the importance of evaluation in their statements.



2015 International Year of Evaluation (EvalYear) was official declared at the [third International Conference on National Evaluation Capacities \(NEC\) in São Paulo, Brazil](#). UNEG and its members have participated in the EvalYear activities. There will be over 71 events all over the world that celebrate and lit the Evaluation Torch. 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2016 Evaluation Week Preparation

2016 will be a crucial year that will see several major processes coming to a new start. With the adoption of the UN General Assembly Resolution on evaluation capacity building, the celebration of the 2015 International Year of Evaluation and the launch of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in 2015, UNEG has a significant opportunity to continue to bring evaluation to the forefront of development work. The SDGs in particular will shape the sustainable and equitable development discourse and action for the next 15 years. To remain relevant and fit for purpose, UNEG will need to strategically position itself as a key player in the global development community, while continuing to strengthen capabilities of UN evaluation functions. The UNEG Chair, Secretariat and the Geneva-based UNEG members have met several times and discussed the preparation and organization of the 2016 Evaluation Week, which will take place from 25 to 29 April 2016 in Geneva. The theme of the Evaluation Week will be finalized soon and four organizational committees of different events will be established.

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

UNEG Report: Evaluation Changes Lives: realizing evaluation's potential to inform the global Sustainable Development Goals

This report is designed to celebrate 2015 as the International Year of Evaluation, the approval of the recent UN General Assembly Resolution A/RES/69/237 on “Capacity building for the evaluation of development activities at the country level”, and the shaping of the post-2015 development agenda. It addresses the added value brought by UNEG and evaluation. It presents an overview of UNEG members and partners’ work, while indicating UNEG role in the post-2015 era: “working on multilevel partnerships to contribute to global evaluation agenda and processes to enhance national evaluation capacity development, with the ultimate goal of achieving better development results that will positively impact people’s lives”.

UNEG Working Paper: UN-SWAP Evaluation Performance Indicator 2014 Reporting Cycle Results

This document has been prepared to inform UNEG members on the United Nations System-Wide Action Plan on Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-SWAP) Evaluation Performance Indicator (EPI) results reported by the UN-SWAP reporting entities. The document provides a brief background of the Chief Executive Board for Coordination (CEB) endorsed UN-SWAP and UNEG support to develop a methodology to help UN entities to comply with the annual reporting against its Evaluation Performance Indicator (EPI). It also provides an overview and analysis of the results of the reports submitted by the UN-SWAP reporting entities against the EPI in 2014 (2014 reporting cycle) and an additional follow up consultation that received responses from 14 reporting entities. In addition, it includes brief information on the process for the UNEG review of the UN-SWAP EPI Technical Note and related Scorecard that took place in 2014. Finally, the document reflects some of the challenges and the reported good practices identified in the 2014 reporting cycle and remedial actions to improve the integration of gender equality in the evaluation function committed by several UN entities and initial recommendations based on the analysis of results from all reporting entities.





UNEG Webinar: How does Evaluation Advance Environment and Sustainable Development? (held on 14 May 2015)





The event featured a book, [Evaluating Environment in International Development](#), and participants discussed why and how evaluation contributes to environment and sustainable development. [Evaluating Environment in International Development](#) provides novel and in-depth perspectives on

the increasingly strategic area of climate change and development evaluation. Moving beyond projects and programs, it considers aspects such as evaluating normative work on the environment and evaluating environmental consequences of economic and social development efforts. It not only aims to stimulate the dialogue and learning process between practitioners and research, but also to provide an encouragement for social change, especially for the most affected people of climate and environmental change in the global South. As Nidhi Khattri (World Bank, Independent Evaluation Group) stated: "The book is a must read for anyone concerned about development and its effects on environment".

Speakers included the book's editor, **Juha Uitto**, Director of the Independent Evaluation Office at the Global Environment Facility (GEF), two contributing authors **Vijayalakshmi Vadivelu**, Evaluation Adviser at the Independent Evaluation Office of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), and **Andy Rowe**, economist and independent evaluator, as well as **Arild Hauge**, Deputy Director at the UNDP Independent Evaluation Office, who served as commentator.

UNEG Webinar: Lessons from the MDG Era: Delivering on the "World's Biggest Promise" (held on 23 June 2015)

How did the United Nations and the World Bank help implement and measure the Millennium Development Goals, and what does that tell us about the post-2015 agenda? 2015 is a momentous year for the United Nations, as the Millennium Development



Goals (MDGs) come to a close and a new global development agenda is being agreed upon for the post-2015 era. The current effort to establish the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) builds upon the momentum of the MDGs and represents a testimony to their usefulness. As we embark on this new strategic effort, it is important to take stock of the MDG experience.

Speakers presented the findings from three recent evaluations pertaining to the MDGs and the support extended to them by the United Nations and the World Bank: Ellen Vinkey, Evaluation Officer, United Nations Office of Internal Oversight Services (OIOS), on the results of a [thematic evaluation of monitoring and evaluation of the MDGs](#), 2015 Olivier Cossee, Evaluation Manager, Independent Evaluation Office, UNDP, on an [evaluation of the role of UNDP in supporting national achievement of the MDGs](#), 2015. Xiaolun Sun, Senior Evaluation Officer, Independent Evaluation Group, World Bank Group, on the World Bank's experience with the MDGs as summarized in the [Results and Performance of the World Bank Group](#), 2014, Fumika Ouchi, UNEG Executive Coordinator; Evaluation Advisor, Independent Evaluation Office, UNDP, Nicholas York, Director of Country, Corporate and Global Evaluations, Independent Evaluation Group, World Bank and Arild Hauge, Deputy Director, Independent Evaluation Office, UNDP, also commented on the topic.
