# Background:

The <u>2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development</u> sets ambitious targets for development. Follow-up and review processes at the global and national levels are to provide evidence, including from country-led evaluations, on the progress to achieve the <u>17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)</u>.



Evaluation is however absent in Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs) of 2016 and 2017. What is the way forward to make evaluation fit-for-purpose to the Agenda 2030?

In the occasion of the High Level Political Forum, the United Nations Evaluation Group (UNEG) has organized a side event on "Accelerating SDG implementation through evaluation: Case of SDG - 6 (WASH)".

- The event aims to promote a multi-stakeholder dialogue to reflect on the importance of evaluation for demonstrating progress towards the SDGs.
- In line with this year's HLPF theme, the side event will focus on SDG-6 and more concretely on WASH evaluations. Building upon WASH evaluation experiences, the presenters will discuss ways to better position evaluation in the implementation of the Agenda 2030.

# **Objectives**:

- 1) Raise awareness on the importance of evaluation to support follow up and review processes towards the SDGs, with especial focus on SDG 6;
- **2)** Generate a dialogue on how best UN agencies and other stakeholders can support countries to use evidence from evaluation to inform WASH policies and programmes;
- 3) Share lessons and good practices from WASH evaluation experiences.

<u>Content:</u> The meeting will discuss how evaluation can reinforce follow-up and review processes at the national level towards evidence-based Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs). More specifically, it will discuss how evaluation can be adapted and used to better assess and guide efforts towards SDG -6. Questions that will guide the discussions are, among others:

- 1) Is evaluation fit-for- purpose to advise member states on progress towards the SDGs? What are the potential roadblocks?
- 2) What needs to be done to ensure that evaluation will generate systematic and timely evidence for HLPF progress reviews?
- 3) Are current approaches to national evaluation capacity development adequate to contribute to the follow up and review processes at the country level?
- 4) How to make the case for country-led evaluations of WASH "fit for purpose for the SDGs"?
